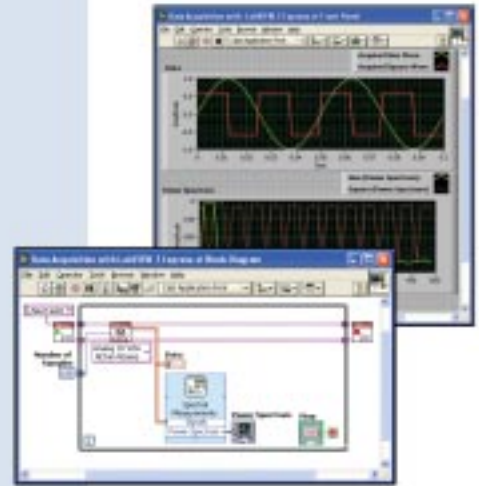

Overview

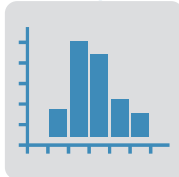
National Instruments LabVIEW is a powerful development environment for signal acquisition, measurement analysis, and data presentation, giving you the flexibility of a programming language without the complexity of traditional development tools.

Typically, measurement and automation applications can be broken up into three primary pieces – acquiring data, analyzing it, and then presenting it to the enterprise. LabVIEW, designed specifically for scientists and engineers, has built-in tools to rapidly design these applications.

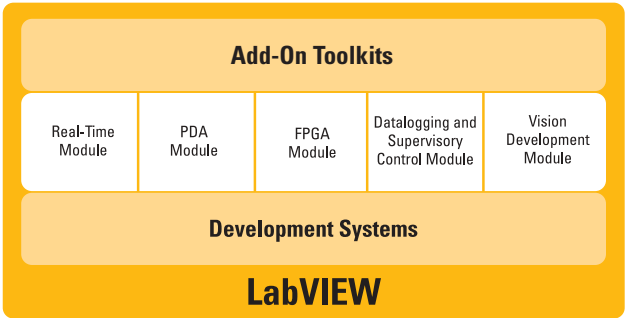

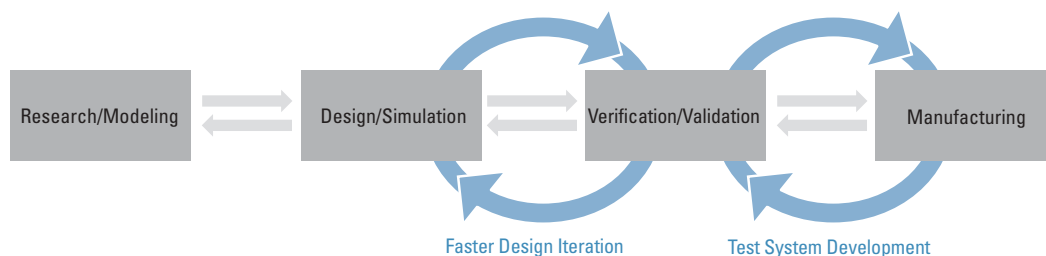

The flexibility and scalability of LabVIEW make it well-suited for initial research and design phases all the way up to large scale manufacturing test processes. By using the single, integrated LabVIEW environment throughout the phases of the design cycle to interface with real-world signals, analyze data for meaningful information, and share results and applications, you can boost productivity throughout your organization.



With NI software and hardware, you can achieve shorter time-to-market by being more efficient at each stage of the design to manufacturing process.

Test and Measurement

LabVIEW is an industry-standard development tool for test and measurement applications. Process Control and Factory Automation

In process control and factory automation applications, many engineers look to LabVIEW for high-speed, high-channel-count measurement and control. For large, sophisticated industrial automation and control applications, the LabVIEW family includes the LabVIEW DSC Module, designed specifically for monitoring large numbers of I/O points, communicating with industrial controllers and networks, and providing PC-based control.

Control Design

The product development cycle from design to production can be reduced using LabVIEW. By integrating LabVIEW closely with top design software and hardware, it is easier to take real-world measurements throughout all phases of the design process. In creating a new product, iteration on models, prototypes, and tests is necessary before arriving at a finished design. Reducing time spent in this iterative process results in shorter time to market. With the integration of LabVIEW tests into the modeling and prototyping stages of development, real-world data can be compared to theoretical models earlier and more easily, resulting in fewer design iterations to achieve the final product.

Academic

Just as LabVIEW revolutionizes industry, it also dramatically affects traditional academic research and teaching. A LabVIEW-based laboratory makes researchers more productive and improves the way students learn. Rather than focusing on sometimes-tedious methods of gathering data, educators and students can focus on results and concepts. Students still learn methodology, but spend the majority of their time executing their experiments instead of building them.

Draw Your Solution with LabVIEW

LabVIEW is at heart a programming language with all the features and functionality of a traditional, text-based language, but with intuitive, graphical development and high-level tools to make development fast for measurement applications.

The basic building block of a LabVIEW application is a virtual instrument (VI), which consists of a front panel and block diagram.

Dataflow Programming

NI LabVIEW uses a patented dataflow programming model that frees you from the linear architecture of text-based programming languages. Because the execution order in LabVIEW is determined by the flow of data between nodes and not by sequential lines of text, you can easily create block diagrams that execute multiple operations in parallel.

Modularity

LabVIEW VIs are modular in design, so any VI can run by itself or as part of another VI.

Compiled Execution

In many applications, execution speed is critical. LabVIEW is the only graphical programming system with a compiler that generates optimized code with execution speeds comparable to compiled C programs. You even can use the LabVIEW profiler to analyze and optimize time-critical operations. LabVIEW increases your productivity without sacrificing execution speed.

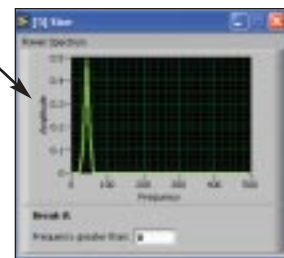

With interactive assistants, code generation, and connectivity to thousands of devices, LabVIEW provides the most comprehensive instrumentation software in the industry with the most intuitive development

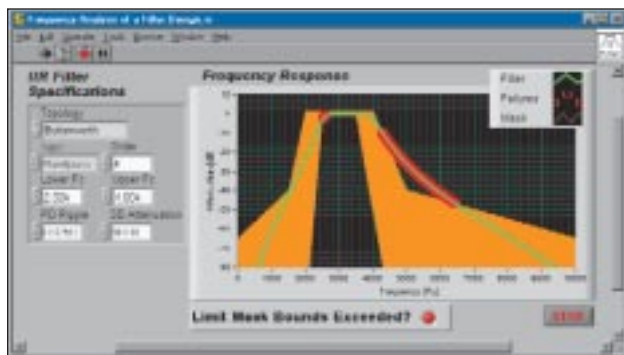
Analyze with LabVIEW

Built-In Measurement Analysis and Digital Signal Processing

With National Instruments LabVIEW, you have the built-in digital signal processing, analysis, and visualization capabilities you need for your measurement applications.

High-level measurement analysis tools simplify development of applications that require common measurement analysis routines such as spectral analysis, filtering, and statistics. At the same time, you have the flexibility to construct custom analysis algorithms using lower-level tools such as linear algebra, FFT, and curve fitting.

The following describes a few highlights of the measurement analysis capabilities of LabVIEW. Visit ni.com/analysis for a complete list and more details; a partial listing appears on page 50.

Measurements and Mathematics

NI LabVIEW includes a variety of other measurement analysis tools. Examples include curve fitting, signal generation, peak detection, and probability and statistics. Measurement analysis functions can determine signal characteristics such as DC/RMS levels, total harmonic distortion (THD/SINAD), impulse response, frequency response, and cross-power spectrum. Using LabVIEW, you can also employ numerical tools for solving differential equations, optimization, root finding, and other mathematical problems.

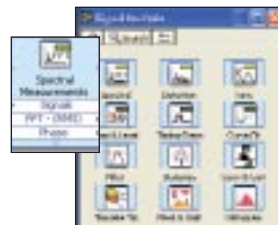

or additional stages of signal processing. More than 10 Express VIs further reduce the complexity of implementing measurement analysis in your application through interactive configuration dialogs in which you can preview analysis results immediately.

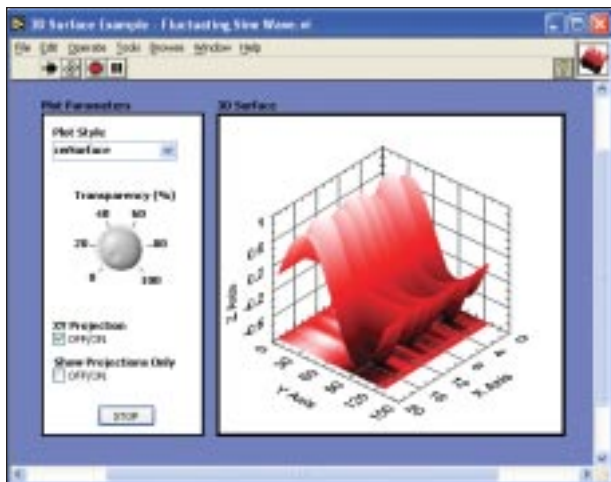

Presentation of your data encompasses visualization, report generation, data management, and connectivity. LabVIEW supplies a wide array of tools to make your data presentation powerful and simple to create.



The data visualization and presentation tools in LabVIEW give you the ability to present your data through reports, graphs, and even Web publishing.

Visualize Your Data

LabVIEW includes a wide array of visualization tools to present data on the user interface of your application. These include tools for charting and graphing, as well as built-in 2D and 3D visualization tools. You can instantly reconfigure attributes of your data presentation, such as colors, font size, graph types, and more, as well as dynamically rotate, zoom, and pan these graphs with the mouse.

Publishing Information to the Web

LabVIEW also includes the ability to publish any application you have developed in LabVIEW to the Web with Remote Panels. Instead of creating an HTML report by hand, you can simply make your application accessible as a Web page. This option requires no programming and has the added benefit of giving you direct access to view and control your application across the Web. Your customers and colleagues can use their Web browser (Netscape Navigator and Internet Explorer are recommended) to open a link to your application to control it or view generated data as it runs.

Generate Professional Reports Quickly

LabVIEW delivers the ability to instantly create text and HTML reports with little or no programming. With the report-generation tools included in LabVIEW, you can build your own reports in HTML format. These VIs can take the data from your application and format it into an HTML report so you can publish your results on the Web, creating an easy addition to any LabVIEW application.

Report Generation with Microsoft Office Tools

You create applications that acquire data, perform online analysis, and present the results on your user interface as the application runs. However, you may want to share the results of your application with colleagues or just store these results in a file format that can be easily shared, such as Microsoft Word or Excel. For this purpose, National Instruments offers the LabVIEW Report Generation Toolkit for Microsoft Office as a library of flexible, easy-to-use VIs for programmatically creating and editing Microsoft Word and Excel reports from LabVIEW. Whether you need to generate reports summarizing test results or compile other statistics to track processes, the LabVIEW Report Generation Toolkit speeds up development of custom, professional reports.

Interactively Manage Data

If you acquire large amounts of data, you may want to interactively analyze that data after the system has executed, creating a report to share data and information. If you find yourself storing megabytes of data to your hard disk, either in a standard file or a database, you should consider an offline data management and analysis tool. National Instruments DIAdem, a configuration-based software package, performs post-acquisition, interactive data management, analysis, and report generation. With DIAdem, you efficiently extract information from acquired data after the acquisition has taken place.
